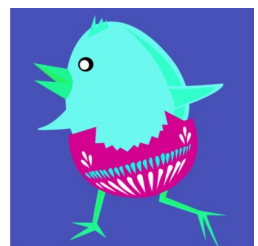
## Notes on a Chalkboard

## Toddler News

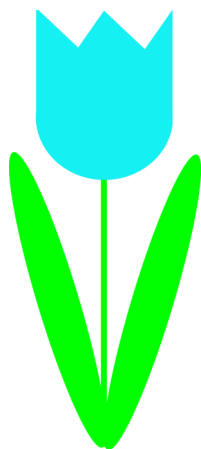
Hello Toddler Families!

## Jr. Preschool News

Hello Junior Preschool Parents!

Is it really March already?! We are zooming through the school year; it will be summer before we know it! We've been having a wonderful time the past few months exploring space and rocketships in January, using our imagination in February becoming princesses and knights, and also celebrating love for Valentine's Day. In March we are focusing on different books from some amazing children's authors, such as Dr. Seuss and Eric Carle. During the month we will be celebrating several holidays and birthdays in the class. We will also be jumping into our theme Weather on the Farm in April with a variety of exciting activities and crafts like making muddy pigs, watercolor sunshines, and footprint tractors.

As the kids get older, they are becoming very self-sufficient. At school, they are capable of doing so many things on their own like using the bathroom, changing their clothes, and cleaning up after themselves. By working on and accomplishing these types of skills, the children gain self-esteem and learn problem solving skills. Here at school it can be easier for them to accomplish self-care tasks since everything is at their level and arranged with the kids in mind. We know it can be more difficult to do these things at home, but we encourage you to look around and see if there are ways you can help your child become more independent. Some ideas for this are:

- \*Make easy to wear, weather appropriate clothing accessible to your kids so that they can pick out their clothes and get dressed in the morning.
- \*In the kitchen, place kid cups, plates, silverware, ect... at child level and provide a stool so they can get a drink of water or help set up for meals.
- \*Place everything your child needs to get out the door (shoes, coats, backpacks) in an accessible location so they can get ready to leave the house on their own.

The other important skill the kids are working on is cooperative play. While some kids have been doing this for a while, others are just beginning. We continue to assist them in conflict resolution by encouraging them to "use their words" to express their wants and frustrations, instead of screaming or hitting.

Last but not least, please remember to bring a pair of rain boots and rain jacket for your child to keep at school. We try to get outside any chance we can, sometimes when it's sprinkling and also right after it rains. It's not always possible to stay dry but having those additional items can really help!

The kids really enjoyed love letter time in February. Thanks for all of your creativity in writing these. The kids felt so special each time I read them a love letter! For the first few weeks in March, we will be focusing on a different color each day. ## Cooks Corner...

By popular request...Jess has agreed to share her recipe for one of our favorite lunches here at the Playschool...Chicken Ranch Pasta!

- 1 lb elbow macaroni pasta
  - 1 C. shredded carrots
  - 1/2 C. fine chopped celery
  - 1 C. cheddar cheese (cubed or shredded)
  - 3-4 C. shredded or chopped chicken
  - 1 packet ranch dressing mix
1. Prepare pasta according to package. While waiting for the pasta to boil gather your celery, carrots, chicken, cheese. Set aside.
  2. To make the dressing, whisk together ranch mix, mayo and milk (see directions on packet). Mix until all lumps are gone.
  3. Once pasta is done, drain and let cool. Once cooled, mix in carrots, celery, cheese and chicken.
  4. Pour dressing over the pasta and stir gently until well combined. Cover and refrigerate for at least 1-2 hours before serving.
  5. Right before serving, give pasta a final stir to mix in any dressing that may have settled to bottom.
